## **Discharge Instructions - Brow & Forehead Lift**

CALL	IMMEDIATELY FOR THESE PROBLEMS: After hours & weekends (512) 533-7355
•	Severe pain. Eyelid or forehead swelling, bruising, or bleeding that is increasing to the point you cannot open your eye(s). Dimming or loss of vision that does not clear with blinking and not caused by ointment. Any evidence of infection, such as purulent or greenish discharge from your incisions, or fever $> 101^{\circ}$ F
NORM	IAL EXPECTATIONS
•	There is usually temporary numbness in the forehead and scalp that can last a few weeks to months after surgery. You may have some temporary oozing of blood from the incision sites overnight.  Expect a certain degree of swelling and bruising in the forehead, eyelids, and temples. You may develop a black eye. Bruising is usually more visible 1-2 days following surgery, and may move into the cheeks.
COLD	COMPRESSES
	Apply cold to forehead and eyelids for days after surgery about 20 minutes of each hour till bedtime. Place dry cloth over forehead and eyelids, then crushed ice or frozen peas in a clean quart size Ziploc bag.
	CATIONS
	Prescription eye drops (e.g., TobraDex) – apply 1 drop to ☐ Right ☐ Left eye(s) 4 times a day for days Apply prescription eye ointment sparingly: ☐ On the stitches times daily for 7 days. ☐ In the eye(s) at bedtime or whenever irritated for 7 days. ☐ Do NOT apply ointment to staples.
	Regular or Extra-Strength Tylenol for mild pain. Prescription pain medication for moderate pain. Take with food.  You were given pain medication in the surgery center. <b>Next dose of pain medication can be taken at DO NOT</b> take Aspirin, Aspirin containing products or anti-inflammatory medications (NSAIDS e.g. Advil, Motrin,
	Aleve, etc.), for 2 days after surgery.
	Blood thinning medication such as Coumadin, Plavix or Aspirin can be restarted on
	Other medications:
	Medrol dose pack (steroid) – take with food and as directed on pack, starting
	Oral antibiotic: if prescribed, first dose is Take with food to avoid nausea.
	Ondansetron as needed for nausea. Next dose:
ACTIV	
	Rest as much as possible after surgery. Sleep with head slightly elevated for first 2 nights.  Avoid bending or any heavy lifting over 20 lbs. for 7 days. You may resume aerobic activity in 7 days.  You may return to work/school in days.
	<b>Do NOT drive</b> while vision is impaired or while taking prescription pain medication.
HYGI	
	You may shower and shampoo hair 24 hours 48 hours after surgery.  Be careful washing and combing your hair to avoid pulling on skin staples.  No eye make-up or concealer to surgical areas until approved by your surgeon.
	Do not wear contact lenses for 7 days.
	Resume regular diet. No alcoholic beverages the day of surgery or while taking prescription pain medication.  Drink adequate fluids to stay well hydrated in the days after surgery.
