•	MMEDIATELY FOR THESE PROBI Pain not controlled by medication.	EMS:	After hours & weeke Office (512) 458-2142	1 M-F 8 am-5pm
 Fever over 101 degrees with increasing pain, redness, swelling, and drainage from wound. If you notice rapid swelling or blood dripping from the incision. DRESSING				
•	Keep the facial/neck dressing dry, and leave dressing in place until seen by your surgeon in follow-up. The dressing on the fat transfer donor site may be removed the next day. Expect drainage from the donor site for first 24 hrs.			
MEDICATION				
	Continue your regular medications unless otherwise instructed by physician. Apply a small amount ofointment to the stitchestimes a day for days. Take prescription pain medication for moderate pain. Tylenol/Extra Strength Tylenol for mild pain. Take pain medication with food to avoid nausea.			
	You were given pain medication in the surgery center. Next dose of pain medication at DO NOT take Aspirin, Aspirin containing products or anti-inflammatory medications (NSAIDS e.g. Advil, Motrin, Aleve, Celebrex, etc.), for 7 days after surgery.			
	Blood thinning medication such as Coumadin, Plavix or Aspirin can be restarted on Other medications: ☐ Promethazine as needed for nausea. Next dose: ☐ Medrol Dose Pack starts			
•	Rest quietly at home for two days after surgery and elevate your head on 2-3 pillows while sleeping. Stay in the company of a responsible adult for 24 hours after surgery.			
•	When bending, bend at knees only, and not from waist. Avoid lifting anything heavier than a gallon of milk for 7 days.			
•	No heavy exercising of any kind for two to three weeks, and until approved by your surgeon.			
•	Wear a cervical foam collar after the bandage is removed to protect your neck, and remove it only for showering.			
•	Wear button down shirts to minimize use of pullover clothing for 2 weeks.			
•	Do not submerge your head underwater in a swimming pool or hot tub for 1 month after surgery.			
•	• Do not drive while taking prescription pain medication. Do not smoke for 2 – 4 weeks following surgery.			
HYGIENE				
•	After the dressings are removed you may shower and gently shampoo your hair.			
• DIET	Numbness of the ears and neck may be present for some weeks after surgery. If using a hair dryer, use with caution on warm setting. Avoid prolonged exposure to cold temperatures.			
•	Resume regular diet. Select foods that are easily chewed and take small bites.			
•	No alcoholic beverages for 1 week after surgery, or while taking prescription pain medication.			
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
